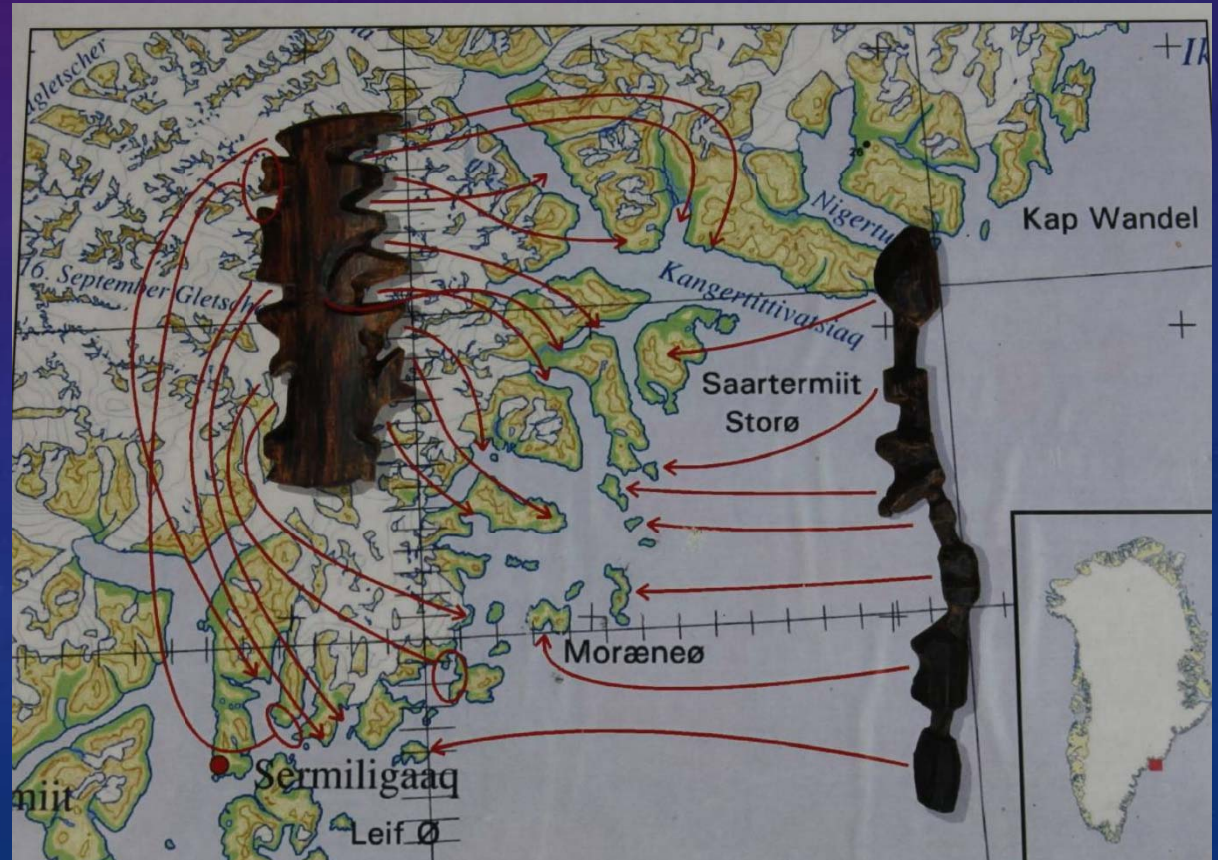
Woodcut maps of the Greenland coast made by Inuit hunter Kuniit



The coastline 100 km northward from Ammassalik, East Greenland.

These woodcut maps were made by the Inuit hunter Kuniit from the Umiiivik settlement in Ammassalik Fiord, and sold to the Danish naval captain Gustav Holm in East Greenland, 1883-85.

Originals are held in the Greenland National Museum and Archives, Nuuk, Greenland.
