
## Beer

#### Fitzwilliam



Silver Tankard, Ausburg, 1650

Chastity, Temperance and Hope shown. Temperance is usually not present and has replaced Faith.



#### Dying Alexander, a Roman copy of a Hellenistic Sculpture

Commissioned Lysippus to create statues.

Drank heavily and killed Cleitus the Black (a highranking general and companion in his army in a drunken rage) Fitzwilliam



Wine Jar Showing Dionysus and The Satyrs, Athens, 510 BC.

Dionysus: god of wine

Dionysus is presented as being mad, causing distrust.

People were willing to accept him as a god provided they could continue to drink.



#### Herakles Dreams of Arcadia, Marian Maguire

The Maori did not have alcohol in New Zealand prior to the European Invasion.

Many Maori tribes implemented legislation for 'dry lands to be created'.

Maenads also show the attitudes towards women and alcohol.

Arcadia = a Utopian ideology and thus this is peculiar in that drunkenness is frowned upon but it is also what Herakles is trying to create.
