


Why this title?

Four Days' Battle painting

- Painted by Abraham Jansz. Stock
- Depicts the Four Days' Battle of 1-4 June 1666
- Something I learned about for my History A Level; was seen as an adventure for many and was the result of international trade conflicts.
- Clearly shows the intensity, very traditional sense of warfare as conflict



Armour for horse and man, c.1520

- Armour's primary purpose was to protect its wearer (as well as reflecting their social status)
- Many myths and legends revolve around the adventures of knights, such as King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table.
- Demonstrative of the link between mythical adventures and real life conflict (such as the Four Days' Battle)




Samurai armour

- Artefacts from around the world bring us closer to culture; perhaps not a literal journey but an imagined one




Waka Taua canoe

- A war canoe from New Zealand
- Demonstrates the links between journeys and conflict, as the canoes were used purely to reach a war
- Their sacred nature creates an impression (for me) that war was perhaps seen as a great honour, and even an adventure for many
