#### FIESTAS: THE DAY OF THE DEAD

The emphasis of much of this display is on religion and the artefacts associated with the festivities held to honour the Saints. Mexico and Central America are ostensibly Catholic countries, but it is a syncretic form of Catholicism.

 $f_{\rm II}$  Mexico alone there are some l.654 Sains for whom fleatas are celebrated every year. Many fietas are location specific while others have a more national character as for example the Day of the Dead (AII Souts) which is celebrated with special emphasis in Central Mexico. The artefacts displayed here were collected both in the 1890's and 1980's but show a remarkable continuity.



The Day of the Dead in early November emphasises death as Carnival in the Spring celebrates regeneration. The tradition is still very strong. The Mexican Government has recently sponsored competitions in secondary schools encouraging pupils to construct models of the altar as built in their homes, in an attempt to increase awareness among the young of the value of the country's traditions.




## Egyptian pot
